

- Financial markets: The Federal Reserve of the USA took two rate cutting measures, which appear to have backfired. Instead of increasing trust levels, the unexpected Fed moves seemed to create more uncertainty and unrest. The US stockmarkets had their worst day on 16 March since Black Monday: minus 12%! Volatility is near creditcrunch levels. There are increasing concerns about the liquidity of the financial system and the solvability of companies. Country- and credit spreads are widening continuously.
- Turkey: After a positive economical turn in the last quarters the Turkish economy showed a V-curve from recession to a surprising 6% growth in Q4. Further rate cut cuts put the central bank rate below 10% but inflation increased again slowly following higher consumer demand and government investment. The TL has slipped away against the USD and EUR in the past weeks around TL 7.00 for a EUR. Outlook was positive for the rest of the year in the view of both governments and most financial analysts.

ECONOMIC UPDATE 1

· *Corona*: The corona virus rapidly has taken an overwhelming grip on the lives of people as well as on the economy and financial markets.

China seems to have the virus under control, the peak in South-Korea looks to be behind us. However in Europe, including Turkey, and the US this is not the case. An increasing number of infected people and casualties are expected.

Europe has gone into a social lock down. Politicians prepare their countries on a longlasting combat against the virus, with heavy concerns on the impact on economy and business activities.

On a positive side, it seems that researchers from Germany, Israel and the USA are close to finding a vaccin.

- Thus, exporters are supported to overcome the uncertainty in this period.
- The top priority is to avoid interruption of production and employment.
- The prerequisite for any company that will benefit from the opportunities in the economy package described above is that it will not cause any loss of employment.
- It is important to quickly meet the liquidity and cash needs
 of firms with credit line in financial institutions and
 organizations, and not to impose any restriction on the use
 of credit lines.
- Financial institutions are expected to take steps to stretch credit conditions in order to maintain employment and economic growth under these circumstances.
- All financial institutions are requested to carefully avoid credit recall, non-extension of existing credit lines, price increase, or making the security conditions difficult.
- It is also requested to respond promptly and positively to the installment, postponement, restructuring and arrangement demands of corporate firms, SMEs, individuals, those who experience loss of income due to temporary loss of work or turnover or similar reasons, regarding their credit debts.
- All financial institutions are expected to follow the recommendations of the Banks Association of Turkey made in this respect.

ECONOMIC UPDATE 2

• THE ECONOMIC STABILITY PACKAGE of Turkey to off-set the negative impact of Corona

With the package called Economic Stability Shield, a financial fund set of one hundred billion Turkish lira is introduced in order to reduce the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Main topics of the package as announced by the government:

- The Central Bank of Turkey takes some very important steps in terms of markets and guarantees that there will be no liquidity shortage.
- In this context, the Central Bank has initiated very important practices for exporters too.
- The open rediscount **credit principal and interest payments** with due dates in April, May and June are postponed to October, November and December, and the maximum maturity is extended by 1 year.
- The committed closure period of **rediscount credits**, which fall due in April, May or June, is also postponed by 1 year.
